"The Savior We Need"

Dear Whitfield Family,

Hello to my brothers and sisters in Christ. Recently, I read *Easter Earthquake: How Resurrection Shakes Our World* by the Rev. Dr. James A. Harnish, who retired after forty-three years of pastoral ministry in the Florida Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. This book is the focus of the current women's Bible study that Patty is facilitating. Harnish shares the following words about Palm Sunday. As Palm Sunday approaches, God is using these words to speak to me. May they speak to you and others.

Jesus must have looked downright foolish riding into the city on a donkey, his legs dangling down so that his toes scraped the dirt and his robe dragged in the dust. You can look important on a warhorse, but it's hard not to look like a fool on a donkey. The comic image raises some important questions:

What if this story gives expression to the way God laughs at pretentious human pride?

What if the Palm Sunday parade is divine satire that punctures our pretensions of power?

What if the man on a donkey is heavenly mockery of human might?

What if the Savior is inviting each of us to get down from our high horses and follow him in the way of humility?

What if a humble savior is not what we want but what we need?

The people who line the path that day shout "Hosanna." That Hebrew word means "help" or "save." It includes the imperative that gives desperate urgency to the cry. The crowd shouts, "Save us now!" They want a savior to come with military, economic and political power to throw out the Romans and reestablish the throne of David. But this is not the kind of Savior God sent.

The peculiar story we tell this week demonstrates that God saves not through the exercise of loveless power but through the experience of what appears to be powerless love. God saves not through the myth of redemptive violence but through the model of redemptive suffering. God saves not by a rearranging of the world's political players but by a radical reorientation of the human heart. God saves not by destroying those who oppose him but by forgiving those who nailed his Son to a cross. God saves not by escaping death but by going with us all the way to the grave.

The man riding into town on a donkey may not be the savior we want, but he is the Savior we need.

Thanks be to God for the most precious and priceless gift of himself, the Savior we need! To God be all glory, honor and praise!


